General information

Tee of Times /Arrival//Etiquette

Tee of Times are generally between 10.30am and 2.30pm, depending on the number of holes being played and the size of your party. Weekdays are fairly flexible with most time available, Saturdays will be between 9.0 and 11.0am and after 2.00pm (depending upon availability), Sundays after 2.30pm. Final tee times will be available from the Professional shop, 3 days prior to your visit. Arrival at the club should be in good time to finalise golfing and catering details and to be on the first tee at your allotted tee off time. Please report to the professional shop who will finalise your arrangements for the day.

Course Warden

Our course warden will be around during your visit. He is there to ensure members and visitors have an enjoyable day. If he advises a course of action, please adhere to his instructions.

Complaints

All complaints must be in writing to the secretary and will be addressed accordingly by the club officials.

Health and Safety

It is the responsibility of all persons playing golf to take care for the health and safety of themselves and others on the course or public foot paths.

Attention is drawn to the public footpaths which cross or run along the course. Please give way to pedestrians using these footpaths. Members and visitors should always ensure that when playing a shot, those in front are out of range and the traditional call of "FORE" should be made immediately in cases where the deviant shot may endanger another golfer on other fairways or tee's etc.

Members and visitors should have adequate golfers insurance to cover all risks, personal liability etc. The club is not responsible for any loss or for any injury sustained.

Warning bells are located on the 14th and after the green on the 17th holes. Please use them to inform those behind "all is clear". On the 1st hole play should not proceed until the players in front have disappeared from site. Likewise on the 5th hole, players should not play their second shot to the green until the players in front are visible on the 6th tee. On the 12th hole, player should not play their tee shots until they can see all the players on the green.

The club is not insured for any golf equipment stored or left lying around the clubhouse premise – members and visitors MUST have their own insurance for such items

Members and visitors must be aware that any member of staff working on the golf course has priority. Members or visitors must not play while staff are working on the hole they are playing. The staff will finish their work as quickly as possible, move away from the area in question and allow the game to proceed.

Dress on the course will be appropriate golf attire:

Acceptable

Golf Hats / caps
Gents collared shirts or shirts designed for golf
Tailored trousers
Tailored shorts, knee length
Proper golf shoes

Unacceptable

Blue denim clothing
Calf length trousers (gents)
Vests and sleeveless shirts
T-shirts or other collarless shirts
Track suits

Shirts and blouses must be tucked in trousers, shorts or skirts as appropriate.

The staff of Crook Golf Club are empowered by the club to enforce these rules for the benefit of all. (Crook Golf Committee.)
